Department Heads

Police – Chief King reported on the incidents handled during the month of February. He completed the Raise Awareness of Zilwaukee School meeting.

Fire – Chief Raasch reported the department responded to 21 incidents in the month of February - 14 were medical. The training for the month was a flash over lecture and what to expect when inside the flash over simulator.

DPW – Director Mahan – Serviced all stations, attended all monthly meetings, attended operators day joint expo, also attended cross connector's class. The DPW used approximately 60 tons of salt this year. The State II water samples were completed.

City Administrator – Administrator Zittel requested that the City not levy the 1 mill for the swimming pool for the upcoming year. This will result in the pool not opening this year. A motion was made by Comstock and supported by Boese not to levy the 1 mill for the pool for the upcoming season. The motion passed. Voting aye: Boese, Bohnsack, Comstock, Luplow and M/Jolin. There will be a resolution for the April Council Meeting to place on the August Primary ballot a one mill for a community center.

He reported that he had been contacted by Consumers Energy concerning replacing our current sodium street lighting with LED lights. The cost would be approximately \$56,000.00. The city would recover the cost in about two and one half years.
