#### **Department Head Reports**

**Police:** Chief King: The Chief gave a report of incidents handled by the department during the month of August. The department attended a training seminar held at the Zilwaukee Fire Station in regards to revised hazard communication standards. The department attended training at the Saginaw County Sheriff's Department on upgrades to mobile computers. He reported that all police radios have been upgraded to the latest state standards.

**Fire:** Asst Chief Inman: The Chief reported on the runs for the month of August. The department was involved in training for boat handling, drafting and the hazardous material identification system. All of the ladder testing was completed and new heat sensors were applied to the ladders.

**DPW:** Director Mahan: Eric reported the I&I group is working with a consultant concerning a SAW grant. They are continuing to remove dead trees on city right of way. They have replaced two meters. Eric has been working with FEMA and submitted paperwork for damage done to the fishing piers during the spring high water. He reported that the pool has been shut down for the season. Glaeser Dawes is set to begin work on Commonwealth on September 16<sup>th</sup>.
