RESOLUTION FOR PROPERTY TRANSFER AFFIDAVIT

The Michigan Tax Commission requires that Municipalities adopt a resolution requiring a penalty to be assessed to buyers of properties if the Property Transfer Affidavit is not filed within 45 days of any transfer of ownership. The resolution also provides that the penalties may be waived as deemed necessary by the City Administrator. The clerk read a resolution as to the above. LOCAL PAVEMENT WARRANTY PROGRAM
