WATER RATE INCREASE

These water rates increase starts July1, 2022 on a quarterly basis.

Water Usage increase \$0.23 to \$4.83

Ready to Serve increase of \$1.80 to \$46.80

Sewer Usage increase of \$0.23 to \$6.33

Ready to Serve increase \$9.00 to \$65.00

PICKLEBALL COURT FENCING
