Policy for Workplace Violence and Weapons

The council received proposed policy 21-02 titled Workplace Violence and Weapons. The policy deals with violence in the workplace and employees having weapons while working. Park Rules Policy

The council received proposed policy 21-01 titled Park Rules. This policy addresses conduct of people using the parks as far as conduct, parking, prohibiting personal fire pits and other items. A motion was made by Kesti and supported by Comstock to adopt the policy. The motion passed. Voting aye: Bohnsack, Comstock, Kesti, Luplow and M/Jolin. Voting nay: none.

Budget Adjustments.

The council was presented with budget adjustments of \$66.07 for Codification of Ordinances and \$300.00 for attorney fees. A motion was made by Kesti and seconded by Bohnsack to approve the adjustments. The motion passed. Voting aye Bohnsack, Comstock, Kesti, Luplow and M/Jolin. Voting nay: none

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Water Rate Increases

Resolution 07-21. The administrator submitted the water rate increases for this year. Sewer rates will be \$6.10 per thousand gallons and Sewer Ready to Serve will be increasing \$9.00. Water rates will be \$4.60 per thousand gallons. Future increases from the City of Saginaw will be automatically applied on the next City billing cycle. A motion was made by Bohnsack and seconded by Luplow to adopt the resolution. The motion passed. Voting aye: Bohnsack, Comstock, Kesti, Luplow and M/Jolin. Voting nay: none

Fireworks Request.

Prince, from Nikki's asked permission to have a fireworks display on July 11th, 2021. The fireworks will be set off by Wolverine Fireworks. A motion was made by Kesti and seconded by Luplow to approve the request. The motion passed. Voting aye: Kesti, Luplow and M/Jolin. Voting nay: Bohnsack and Comstock.

Auditor Contract Renewal

The administrator presented the fees for the renewal of the city auditor: 2021- \$6805.00, 2022 - \$6965.00 and 2023 - \$7065.00. A motion was made by Luplow and seconded by Bohnsack to renew the auditor's contract. The motion passed. Voting aye: Bohnsack, Comstock, Kesti, Luplow and M/Jolin. Voting nay: none.

Riverfront Electrical

A quote of \$2,205.00 was received from Nelson Electric for electrical work to install security cameras at the riverfront park. A motion was made by Kesti and seconded by Bohnsack to approve the quote. The motion passed. Voting aye: Bohnsack, Comstock, Kesti, Luplow and M/Jolin. Voting nay: none.

There being no other business a motion was made by Luplow and seconded by Comstock to adjourn. The motion passed. Voting aye: Bohnsack, Comstock, Kesti, Luplow and M/Jolin. Voting nay: none.
