Utility Policy Fees Amendments

The administrator and DPW Supervisor have reviewed the City Utility Policy and recommend several changes to fees to charge for turnoff/turn on fees, Water tap-in and inspection fees, Water Readiness-to-Serve, Water use rate, Quarterly sewer charge, sanitary sewer inspection fees and sewer readiness-to-serve charges. Local Pavement Warranty Program

The Michigan Legislature created a requirement (MCL 247.66) as part of the Transportation Package of 2015 that requires each city and village to adopt a Local Agency Pavement Warranty Program that was approved by the Michigan Department of Transportation in 20018. A resolution was read by the clerk to implement the Warranty Program. A motion was made by Boese and seconded by Bohnsack to adopt the resolution. The motion passed. Voting aye: Boese, Bohnsack, Comstock and M/Jolin. Voting nay: none

Second Reading Ordinance 58 – Recreational Marijuana

At the February 4th, 2019 Council Meeting a public hearing was held for Proposed Ordinance 57 – Prohibiting marijuana establishments within the city limits. The clerk offered the first reading of the proposed ordinance at the public hearing. This was pursuant to the Michigan Regulation and Taxation of Marijuana Act, Section 6.1.

The clerk offered the second reading of the proposed ordinance. A motion was made by Boese and seconded by Bohnsack to adopt Ordinance 57. The motion passed. Voting aye: Boese, Bohnsack, Comstock and M/Jolin. Voting nay none.

A motion was made by Comstock and seconded by Bohnsack to adjourn. The Meeting was adjourned at 6:45 p.m.
