City Council Open Seats

It is time to start thinking about the Zilwauke City Council election as there are at least two seats being vacated in November. If you are passionate about the City of Zilwauke and are interested in getting involved in politics on the local level, please stop by the office.


Nominating petitions and affidavits to file for the positions can be picked up and filed in the Clerk's Office at the Zilwauke City Hall.

There is a required minimum of 25 signatures from registered City of Zilwauke voters.

Deadline to file is April 23, 2024, at 4:00 p.m.

Filing Procedure for Council Candidate

1. Obtain Nominating Petition from the city office
2. File completed petition to the city office by April 23rd, 2024 by 4:00 p.m.
 - a. Petition must have at least 25 but not more than 50 signatures.
 - b. Make sure you read the back of the petition for instructions.
3. Bring a copy of your birth certificate or prove of citizenship to the city office with your petitions
4. Complete an Affidavit of Identity and Receipt of Filing form when you file your petitions.
5. Complete a Statement of Organization Form for Local Candidates and file with the county clerk.
6. You must have been a resident of the City of Zilwauke for at least 2 years.



When dropping water bill or tax payments in the side door, please put name, address and phone number on the front of the envelope. This will ensure that the payment gets credited to the correct account. Thank you in advance!

Brush Set Out Guidelines

1. Branches must be organized neatly at the curbside in piles no higher than three feet with branches all oriented in the same direction, butt towards road; otherwise, pile will be refused.
2. Vines, stumps, root balls, and similar materials cannot be run through the chipper and will be refused.
3. Branches intermixed with fence posts, wire or building materials will be refused.
4. Logs longer than 8 ft or larger in diameter than 4" will be refused. The most efficient length to chip is **6 ft**.
5. The chipping crew will be allowed **15 minutes** per stop, therefore, use reason in determining the quantity you put out for chipping.
6. This service will not be used as a tree removal service and the Department of Public Works will reserve the right to refuse pick up in instances of obvious abuse.
7. Brush shall not be brought in from property other than that directly adjacent to the curb where it is placed. If the DPW suspects that the brush did not originate from adjacent property, they will try to verify that it is from there, and if they cannot verify it, the pile will be refused.

For your convenience the City will have a dumpster at DPW for drop-offs.

Must be a Zilwaukee resident, and show proof of residency. 1 truck load per home.

No paint, oil, liquids, chemicals, yard waste or tires.

Bring unwanted bulky items.

Zilwaukee Clean-up Week: Volunteers needed to help clean up around the City.

Please stop by the office the week of May 13th to pick up a trash bag and get a street to walk down or a park to canvas. Any assistance is greatly appreciated.

Protect Natural Floodplain Functions - Do not litter. All trash, can ultimately make it to the drainage ditches and ultimately the Saginaw River.

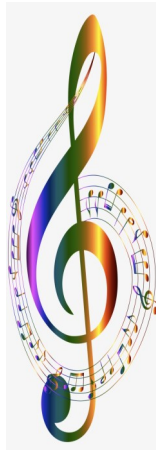
